

MR. VITANGCOL. (Continuing) ... accounted for all the CF cards in Metro Manila.

THE CHAIRPERSON. In Metro Manila.

MR. VITANGCOL. Yes, Your Honor.

THE CHAIRPERSON. And yet you have one.

REP. SUSANO. Yes.

THE CHAIRPERSON. What you're saying is you have one and there is this guy, who is obviously lying, saying that he has it all, unless yours is not the real one.

REP. SUSANO. No. He said it's authentic.

THE CHAIRPERSON. You don't even give them the CF card...

REP. SUSANO. No, it's authentic.

THE CHAIRPERSON. ... You just give them the contents.

REP. SUSANO. Yeah. We...

THE CHAIRPERSON. By the way, is this authentic? Would you be able to deduce from the content that it came from an authentic card but you would not be able to say it was the card she carried around?

MR. FLORES. No, the content looks from an original file generated by the automated election system. However, that content can come from any card being copied in a computer... (*interrupted*)

THE CHAIRPERSON. Not necessarily the card she's been bandying being around?

MR. FLORES. Until we don't see the cards, for instance, and we see the barcodes, for instance, we know... Okay. This card was sent to... was originally intended for this precinct, right? And then if the data that is inside is from that precinct, we can say, "*okay, it comes from...*"

THE CHAIRPERSON. Even if you never had... Even if you don't have the possession of the CF card?

You want to say something?

REP. SUSANO. Serial number... we have serial number.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Okay. Go ahead.

MS. QUIMSON. Yeah. We do have the serial number of the card. It was taken down.

THE CHAIRPERSON. So basically you're confirming that, you know, even if you don't have the physical possession of the card the contents indicate it's real.

MR. FLORES. It's the content from a precinct that was narrated by the AES.

THE CHAIRPERSON. That still does not belie the statement of the NCR Director that he has all the CF cards. Because what they're saying is you could have taken the contents from one of the CF cards that this NCR Director has says it's already with him and we might have done it last week and then presented it.

REP. SUSANO. Mr. Chairman, absolutely. He said that absolutely.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Yeah. Why don't you just give the card? Yes.

REP. SUSANO. Okay. I'll give it to you.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Give it to me now already so that...

REP. SUSANO. Not to them, ha? I trust you but I don't trust them because you're the Chairman. You're my friend, you know. (*Laughter*). Remember that.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Absolutely. Ompong Plaza and I are your followers. Okay.

So... what will I do with that card? (*Laughter*)

REP. GOLEZ. Just hold.

REP. SUSANO. Keep it as a souvenir and as a history.

THE CHAIRPERSON. All right. Thank you very much.

With that...

REP. DELA CRUZ. Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Yes.

REP. DELA CRUZ. Before we adjourn. Again, I would like to request, Director Tolentino, if it is possible for us to get an inventory. We've been asking for this inventory for sometime. I suppose they have it already, the machines deployment, *et cetera*, also for the cards, and, at the same time, for us to complete our analysis of what happened in certain areas, especially for card replacement, Mr. Chairman.

It will be proper, I think, for us to have an idea how many cards were replaced in Pangasinan, Nueva Ecija, Biliran, Bacolod, Lanao Sur, Davao del Norte, because these are the specific areas where we found certain problems, Mr. Chairman. I will request, Director Tolentino, to give us... to give us this information so that we can

complete our report, at the same time, for us to be given the opportunity to have IT experts get to see the super-server as mentioned earlier so that we have... we can vanish from our minds all of this information or things about what's happening in the NC...

THE CHAIRPERSON. Your request will be incorporated in the report because, obviously, we cannot... I don't know when it will be complied with, and then when the new Congress resumes, and I believe there are some of the fiercest critics of automation will be were reelected, and they will have access both to these questions and some of the information we elicited, Mr. Chairman, they may well kill automation by 2013.

Yes.

REP. M. V. DEFENSOR. Mr. Chairman, my amendment to the request, may I say that Quezon City be included for and in behalf at least of Congresswoman Susano.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Yes. Thank you very much.

REP. DUMPIT. Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Is there any motion to adjourn?

REP. DUMPIT. For the record also, Mr. Chairman, that the CF cards in the Province of La Union were reconfigured in the Office of the Provincial Election Supervisor and some of the CF cards were sent to the province also of Pangasinan.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

THE CHAIRPERSON. Yes. With that may we have the motion to adjourn?

REP. M. V. DEFENSOR. I move to adjourn.

THE CHAIRPERSON. This meeting is adjourned.
